

Cathay Pacific resumes flights from Italy

The airline reopened the direct connection between Italy and Hong Kong with a weekly flight to and from Milan Malpensa airport.



On 24 September Cathay Pacific reached an important milestone by celebrating its 75th Anniversary, and now returns to the Italian skies with news: starting from 6 November, thanks to the gradual reopening of travel following the Covid-19 pandemic, the airline will return to flying from Malpensa airport, with a weekly schedule, on board its modern and increasingly sustainable A350-1000 aircraft.



Flight CX234 will depart every Saturday at 11:45 a.m. from Milan Malpensa Airport, while flight CX233 will take off every Friday from Hong Kong International Airport at 00:50 a.m. (local time).

The A350-1000 is the largest aircraft of Cathay Pacific's fleet and it features a three-class configuration: 46 seats in Business Class, 32 in Premium Economy Class and 256 in Economy Class, for a total of 334 seats.



Every detail on board has been designed to enhance the quality of the passengers' travel experience in every class of flight and welcome them in a comfortable environment, offering the best conditions for rest and guarantee each passenger total freedom of control and organization of the space and entertainment system, customizing them according to your needs for work, fun and relaxation.

Constant commitment to safety

Last year, to give its travellers greater confidence, Cathay Pacific launched 'Cathay Care': an advanced package of measures to protect passengers from departure to arrival at their destination, with digitalised check-in procedures that respect social distancing, new lounge and dining access rules, disinfectant gel dispenser stations on board and the distribution of branded kits containing disposable hygiene wipes and a spare mask.

Cabin cleanliness remains a must for the carrier which for five years has been at the top of the list of the ten cleanest airlines in the world according to Skytrax, and now renews its commitment to carefully sanitising the environment and purifying the air on board with HEPA surgical filters, a sign of the attentive and personalised service that distinguishes Cathay Pacific, in full compliance with current regulations.
